# Combined Stakeholder Meeting Date: November 20, 2024 Time: 2:00 PM Location: Haven House, 1411 Union Blvd, Allentown, PA / Hybrid via Zoom

#### I. Welcome and Introductions

Meeting commenced with welcome by Kristy Cole, and introductions of in-person and remote attendees.

#### II. Review of 7/24/24 Meeting Minutes

Minutes from the July 24, 2024, meeting were acknowledged. No formal corrections were presented.

#### III. Provider Forum

#### KidsPeace - Compliance Officer Networking Group - Cliff Aulisio

- Cliff from KidsPeace proposed reviving a compliance peer group for professionals managing compliance, internal audits, or risk management.
- A kickoff Zoom meeting is planned for January. Electronic flyer will be sent via Tom Walker.
- Group will focus on sharing resources, navigating privacy issues, and supporting isolated roles in agencies.

#### Haven House – Program Updates – Laura Keiderling

- Four staff earned Certified Psychiatric Rehabilitation Practitioner (CPRP) certification.
- Two new grief and loss groups announced:
  - PRS Group: Tuesdays at 10:00 AM
  - Outpatient Group: Thursdays, 5:00–6:30 PM (free for clients; \$100 for others)

#### Preventive Measures Community Support Worker Program – Tiah Jones

- Three new Community Health Workers hired and onboarding.
- New contract with Lehigh County Children and Youth to support families involved with children and youth and dual diagnosis mental health/substance use disorder.
- Referrals open with flexible criteria for adults with dual diagnoses.
- Short-term outpatient treatment available for uninsured individuals.

## Acadia Comprehensive Treatment Centers – Carrie Kupferschmid

- Carrie announced new locations:
  - Reading location expected to open December 2024.
  - Easton facility anticipated in Q1 2025.

## NAMI Lehigh Valley – Donna Thorman

- New bilingual staff member hired to support underserved demographics.
- Offerings include:
  - Free peer and family education and support groups.
  - FaithNet program for faith-based communities of all backgrounds.
  - Spring guardianship event with attorney guest speaker.
  - NAMI Basics online course for families with young children.

## **Clarion Psychiatric Center – Crystal Jones**

- Serving patients ages 10 and up.
- New virtual tour available online.
- DBT training initiated for 25 staff; full rollout expected in 2025.
- Accepts most insurances, including Medicaid and VA; can assist with MA applications.

## Pyramid Healthcare – Tamara McGee

- Opened Mental Health Enhanced Outpatient Program in Allentown.
- Serves adults and adolescents (12+), offering 6 hours of weekly group therapy.
- Quick access to psychiatric and MAT medications.

## Lotus Behavioral Health – Lax Rhode

- Accepting clients ages 6–65 for therapy and med management.
- Accepts Medicaid, Highmark, IBX (not Medicare).
- Appointments available within 7 days; psychiatry access in 3–4 weeks.
- Requested input on telehealth e-signature solutions:
  - Suggestions: Adobe Pro, doxy.me, PandaDoc
- Additional discussion on HIPAA compliance and Magellan audit documentation requirements.

## **IV. Advisory Committee Reports**

## a. Member/Family Advisory Committee – Ronnie Colbert

- Announced Haven House's annual Thanksgiving Dinner and upcoming Christmas Party.
- Expressed ongoing advocacy and peer support, including challenges with LANta transportation delays and staff responsiveness.
- Highlighted the importance of community, tradition, and peer mentorship among members.

## b. Provider Advisory Committee – Vacant

- Position remains open. Call for volunteers from the adult mental health provider network.
- Responsibilities include attending CHA meetings and reporting at the HealthChoices Advisory Board.

## c. Children's Advisory Committee – Mike Ramsey (Reported by Tom Walker)

- Update on Day of Caring: Providers supported a program for children of incarcerated parents.
- Proposal to hold another holiday social for Community Connections in December or January.
- Workforce and service system updates discussed.

# V. Magellan Behavioral Health Report

## a. Compliance – Patty Marth

- Key email blasts:
  - Collaborative documentation expectations
  - Audio-only telehealth rules (only for lack of access, not convenience)
  - Annual compliance training materials
- RTF regulations open for public comment until Dec 2.
- Psychiatric Rehabilitation regulations delayed until 2026.
- Peer support statewide quarterly meetings announced.
- CMS released Four Walls Final Rule; OMHSAS may opt in.

## b. Network – Mike Ditty (via John Lees)

- Providers reminded of 90-day notice requirement for site/service closures.
- Communication with Magellan and counties is essential to ensure smooth transitions.

## c. Member and Family Advocate – John Lees

- Urged providers to review and update their Magellan Provider Search entries for accuracy.
- Clarified that changes made in surveys do not automatically update the online tool.

# d. Recovery and Resiliency – Janet Verga

- Peer Support Network meeting featured speaker from AmeriHealth on wellness integration.
- Member Advisory Workgroup scheduled for Dec 10 with cultural diversity as the focus.
- Inviting speakers for 2025 peer meetings.

# e. Strategic – Tom Walker

- October 23rd Behavioral Health Symposium convened executive leaders; workgroups focused on:
  - ED Boarding
  - o Workforce
  - o Continuum of Care
  - o SDoH & DEI
- Next symposium scheduled for April 2025.
- Harvest Full of Hope Recovery Conference was highly successful.
- Invitations forthcoming for Cliff's Compliance Group, Community Connections Holiday Event, and Magellan's December Member Advisory Workgroup.

- Concern Respite Program: 4 members; effort underway to expand in Lehigh County

- CAMS training delayed due to contract negotiation; early 2025 launch anticipated.
- Forensic specialist Nicole Seiple has left the county; contact Kathy Crowmer temporarily.
